

Transforming Healthcare Planning, Design and Construction Symposium

This is a free event open to those interested in the future of healthcare planning, design and construction

Following the establishment of the Bartlett Real Estate Institute (BREI) at Here East Stratford and the acquisition of the former MARU (Medical Architectural Research Unit) Library, University College London (UCL) are hosting a symposium to discuss the future of healthcare planning, design and construction.

The morning session will include a welcome address from Professor Andrew Edkins to discuss the Bartlett Real Estate Institution's vision, followed by a senior member from NHS Improvements outlining the NHS strategy for healthcare planning, to set the current context.

Members of UCL will then outline the existing areas of teaching and research being undertaken and propose the formation of a new healthcare network of practitioners, researchers and strategists to contribute towards transforming healthcare planning, design and construction.

The afternoon session will consist of a Workshop led by UCL and Architects for Health where delegates will break up into groups and discuss questions such as:

- What areas of research are you interested in?
- What type of courses and teaching would you like to be provided?
- Who should be able to access the MARU Collection?
- What can UCL do to support you?
- Are you interested in being part of a larger network?

A faculty panel from UCL will chair and sum up the findings from the group presentations, with a closing address from the Dean of the Bartlett Faculty of the Built Environment and with a proposal to hold a conference in 2020 to celebrate both the Bartlett's 60th Anniversary of facilitating healthcare design and the MARU 2020 Vision. A full agenda will be issued in October 2018.
