Context -Trauma Informed Care

- 59% of people in the UK have experienced trauma (Healthwatch 2025)
- Trauma Informed Care developed in early 2000s in the USA and looked at the importance of psychological safety, empathy, empowerment and control in health, care and support settings
- Biopsychosocial model – holistic, person centred and focused on understanding the what and why and how to support
- Growing evidence that health and care systems and services can and do re-traumatise individuals, albeit unintentionally

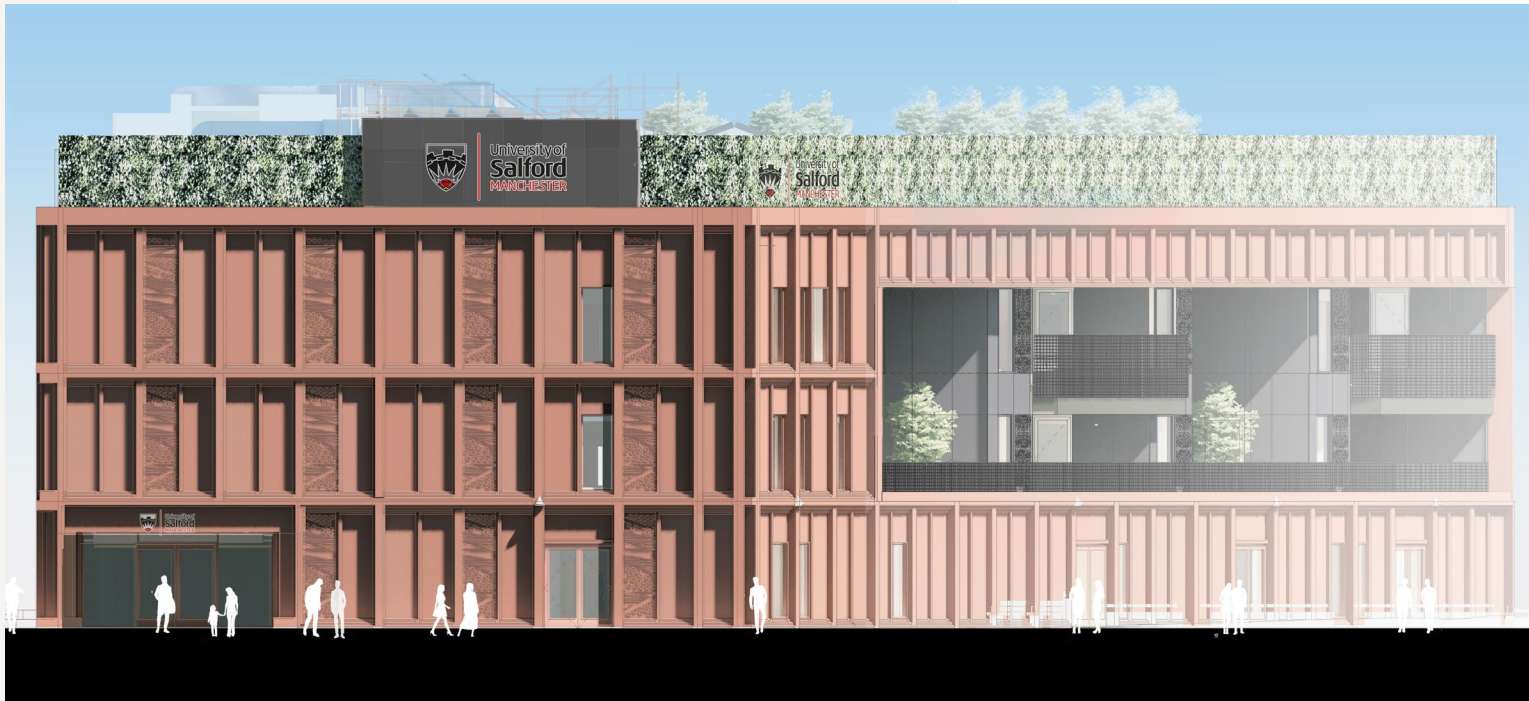

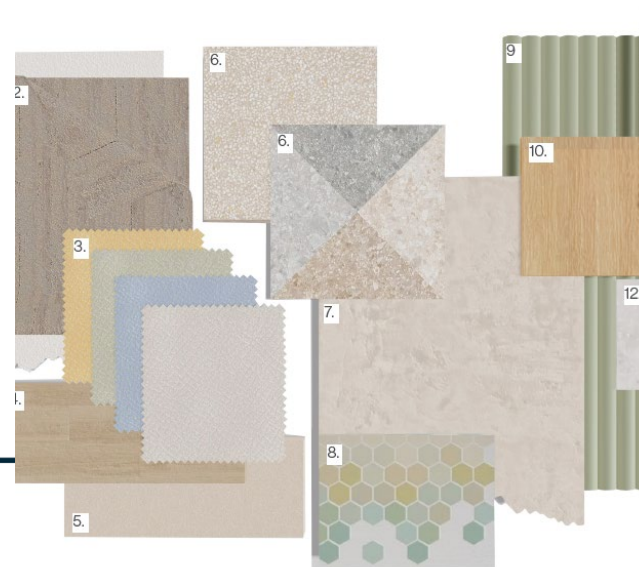
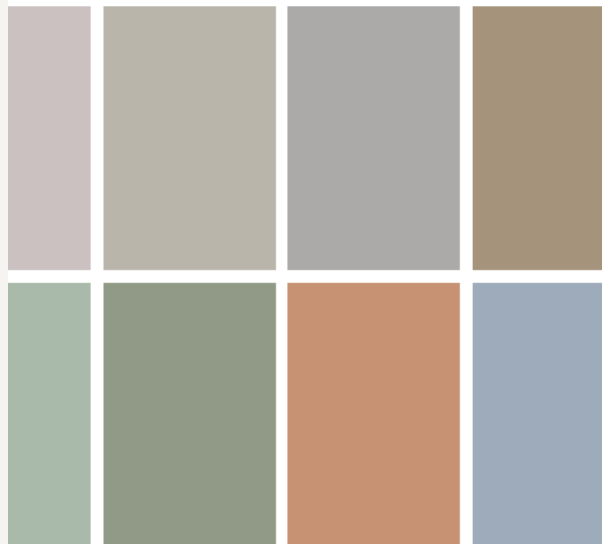
